

Fees

Fee for Bahasa Indonesia courses are Rp 3,700,000 per student. Each level comprises 30 hours of classroom tuition. Successful students will receive a report on their progress and a certificate at the end of the course.

Participants who wish to enter the program at Level 2 or higher will need to take a placement test.

Program

The IALF offers a comprehensive six-level program in Bahasa Indonesia from beginner to intermediate level.

With over twenty years experience in teaching Bahasa Indonesia, we understand the communication challenges that arise in a cross-cultural environment. The program is aimed at those who are serious about learning to communicate in Indonesian.

Teachers

Instructors are experienced native-speaker teachers of Indonesian as a Foreign Language. All hold a university degree and teaching qualification, and understand the types of difficulties experienced by adult language learners. Though they will teach primarily through the medium of Indonesian, all are fluent speakers of English.

Schedule

Classes are held twice a week after office hours, 18:00 to 19:30, at the IALF language centre. Each level of the program runs for 10 weeks.

Bahasa Indonesia courses are offered for the following periods in 2020:

Term II	6 April - 18 June
Term III	6 July - 10 September
Term IV	5 October - 10 December
