Facilities

The IALF training and resource centre, features:

Fees

Fees are Rp 3,700,000 and include tuition, all materials and an IALF Folder.



The IALF offers a five-week semi-intensive course in Bahasa Indonesia, suitable for beginners. The course has been designed for those who have recently arrived and therefore includes information on customs and cross-cultural issues.

The course begins with topics such as introductions and greetings, naming objects, telling the time, dates, months and years and builds to include, shopping and prices, making comparisons, location and directions.

Instructors are experienced native-speaker teachers of Indonesian as a Foreign Language. All hold a university degree and teaching qualification, and understand the types of difficulties experienced by adult language learners. Though they will teach primarily through the medium of Indonesian, all are fluent speakers of English.
